

The Dependent Disclosure Form

Rules for Claiming Children:

When you are claiming a dependent who is a child, there are further requirements:

- The child must have lived with you for at least half of the year.
- The child must be related to you as a son, daughter, stepchild, foster child, brother, sister, stepbrother, stepsister, or a descendant of any of those.
- The child must be 18 or younger at the end of the year, or under 24 if a student. To be a student, the child must have attended school full-time during at least five months of the year. The five months do not have to be in a row.
- The child must be younger than you (or your spouse, if married filing jointly), unless the child is disabled.

Claiming Other Relatives and/or Unrelated Persons as your Dependent:

To claim a relative(s) or an unrelative person(s) on your tax return please consult with the tax preparer. The tax preparer will need the following information for each to determine if you could claim the person(s) as your dependent.

- Annual income
- Date of Birth
- Health Status
- The relationship of the person to you.
- If the person lives with you or not
